Known for bourbon distilleries, tobacco farming, bluegrass music, and of course, Kentucky Fried Chicken, Kentucky and the surrounding area has some of the best of what America has to offer. Reflecting what made this region great are the majestic Oak barns indicative of a once booming agrarian economy. Standing strong for over 70-80 years, these barns were once used to dry tobacco leaves, house whiskey barrels for aging bourbon, or protect livestock and food from the changing seasons. Scattered throughout the Kentucky, Tennessee, and Virginia region, these barns were built of the native Oak, most notably from the beautiful Cumberland Mountain range.
