## Alaskan Yellow Cedar

In 1919 the Hollywood Bowl opened in the chaparral of the Hollywood Hills and today is still the largest natural outdoor amphitheater in the United States, with 18,000 seats. Home to the Hollywood Bowl Orchestra and a popular venue for concerts, orchestras, musicals and other productions, the Hollywood Bowl is where so many household names solidify their careers.

Alaskan Yellow Cedar is typically a pale yellow but when weathered, it becomes a uniform lighter grey. This beautifully worn wood has a vintage grey patina from sitting in the LA sun for a couple decades. The cedar's character is smooth, tightly-knotted and old growth. Some boards even display seat numbering. This modernly urban yet warm cedar originated from Alaska, vacationed in LA and soon will be retiring in your next project.
